### LOOKING INTO THE LIFE OF CHRIS CRUTCHER

- Chris Crutcher was born on July 17, 1946 in Dayton, Ohio but soon moved to Cascade, Idaho
- He grew up in the small ranch and cattle town of Idaho and draws on this small town setting for most of his books
- School was never a favorite of Crutcher; he only ever read To Kill a Mockingbird
- He had an older brother who was athletic and scholarly and seems similar to Cody in Deadline
- Became inspired to write when he was asked to help edit his friend's manuscript (Terry Davis)
- First novel Running Loose in 1983



- Ten years as teacher in alternative school




### **AWARDS**

- ALA has named eight of Crutcher's YA books to this list, including Staying Fat for Sarah Byrnes in 2010.
- Four of his books appeared on *Booklist's Best 100 Books of the 20th Century*, put out in 2000; this was more than any other single author on the list
- ALAN Award in 1993. Award given by the Assembly on Literature for Adolescents to acknowledge those who have made an outstanding contribution to the field of YA literature.
- NCTE SLATE Intellectual Freedom Award in 1998, given to those that advance the cause of intellectual freedom.
- Margaret A. Edwards Lifetime Achievement Award in 2000, for his books Staying Fat for Sarah Byrnes (1994), Athletic Shorts (1991), Chinese Handcuffs (1989), The Crazy Horse Electric Game (1987), Stotan! (1986) and Running Loose (1983). This award is given by Young Adult Library Services Association to an author for their lifetime achievement and contribution to young adult literature.
- California's Young Reader's Medal in 1987 for Staying Fat for Sarah Byrnes


### **SPORTS**




### TRUTHS VS. SECRETS

- There is always a battle in many of his characters between telling the truth and keeping a secret
- Ben Wolf in *Deadline* (keeping secret of disease from everyone)
- Sarah Byrnes in Staying Fat for Sarah Byrnes (cause of her facial deformity)
- Moby in Staying Fat for Sarah Byrnes (knows about Sarah Byrnes)
- Paul in Period 8 (who he cheated on Hannah with)
- Mary in Period 8 (why she disappered)

- While Crutcher had loving parents growing up (a functioning alcoholic mom and a retired Air Force bomber pilot dad), he draws most of his ideas from past experiences with his work as a therapist and teacher
- Sarah Byrnes was based on a young child he had treated in therapy who received similar abuse at the hands of her stepfather
- Sooner's abusive father in Deadline
- The ex-priest Rudy in Deadline
- Mary's sexual encounter in Period 8
- Arney in Period 8



This was a banner made by students at a school in Texas




